BASIL ENTWISTLE, Oxford University graduate with First Class Honors in Philosophy, Politics and Economics, is a director of Moral Re-Armament in the United States, Japan and Britain. At the invitation of Japanese political and industrial leaders he developed MRA's program in Japan in 1950-58. During World War II he served in the U.S. Army and Air Force, was commissioned in the field, awarded the Bronze Star and edited several Air Force publications. Recently as first chairman of the Board of Trustees he prepared the founding of Mackinac College.

JOHN MCCOOK ROOTS, an honors graduate of Harvard and former Crimson editor, was a foreign correspondent in China and Russia during Communism's rise to power. An authority on Asian affairs, he has lectured for the Foreign Policy Association and written for *The New York Times*, *North American Newspaper Alliance* and magazines here and abroad. As a director of Moral Re-Armament in the United States and Britain, he was a pioneer of its early development in Europe, Africa and North America, traveling and working in 81 countries.
