Wallace Stegner was born in Iowa and spent his childhood in towns through the American and Canadian northwest. "I grew up careless," he says, "like any frontier boy; I grew up killing things. I don't kill things any more, and I have been getting less and less careless about country.... So, if I have any cause that itches me more than any other, it is conservation.... I have worked with various conservation societies and have acted as a special assistant to Stewart Udall when he was Secretary of the Interior. And where do I live by preference, when I am not teaching? Vermont. Why? Because it is, in most of the ways of freedom and space, more like the West I grew up in than most of the Contemporary West is."

Mr. Stegner is the author of some twenty books, among them *Beyond the Hundredth Meridian*, *All the Little Live Things*, *A Shooting Star*, *The Sound of Mountain Water*, *Big Rock Candy Mountain*.
